A "Premier" journal refers to the most respected and impactful outlets within the broad disciplines represented within the Block School. In determining whether a journal should be considered premiere, consideration should be given to factors such as the impact factor, acceptance rates, the renown of the journal's editorial board, inclusion on a widely-regarded 3rd party lists of journal quality, and the degree to which it is regarded as rigorous and prestigious across disciplines. Journals of this sort usually require multiple and lengthy revisions, with extensive editorial feedback provided and months typically spent on each revision." Regarding other e-ship journals considered equal to, below or above, "it is up to the faculty member to justify... legitimate evidence to be presented relating to the quality of the work in uestion in addition to attributes of the journal or press. It should be noted that faculty are encouraged to participate in cross-disciplinary research and the assessment of a journal should be based on the standing of the journal in its discipline. It should also be noted that differences exist across the disciplines represented in Bloch as it relates to editorial practices and citation rates. So, for example, if a faculty member is publishing in AMJ/SMJ/Org Science, that is fine, and he/she probably has an easier case to make that his or her output is at a 'premier' level. But, we could also take a person who is publishing in, for example, SBE and JSBM. If that person is publishing a lot (say 5-6 articles over 5-6 years), but each of those papers are becoming highly cited and are all part of a

There is a discrete section for entrepreneurship and innovation; it was updated in 2018 and can be downloaded: (https://charteredabs.org/academic-journal-guide-2018). It outlines the rationale for the rankings and the methodology used. They are ranked 0 - 4 with three four star journals [JBV, SEP, ETP] and a strong cohort of 3 and 2 star entrepreneurship and innovation journals. As ever there is debate around the rankings as economics and psychology have considerably more 4 star journals but also, have far more longevity in the field compared to entrepreneurship. For those institutions who do offer financial incentives for publishing, which is unusual in the UK, they would map back to the CABS list and FT top 50 journals - they would offer more for 4* journals of distinction such as AMJ - there are no journals of distinction in entrepreneurship at present.
